REVIEW OF THE FILM “HARRY POTTER AND THE PRISONER OF
AZKABAN”.

Released in 2004, is “Harry Potter and the prisoner of Azkaban” is one of my favourites. Based on a novel “Harry Potter” by J.K. Rowling, it’s directed by Alfonso Cuaron. A constellation of famous Daniel Radcliffe, Rupert Grint, Emma Watson starred in the film. A typical fantasy product, aimed at both young and adult audience, it collected hundreds of millions during the release, being second-popular after Shrek 2.

I decided to watch the film because my friends told me that the film’s very interesting and I watched it on TV.

The plot develops around three students: Harry Potter, Ron Weasley, Hermione Granger, who has studied at Hogwarts School of witchcraft and wizardry for three years. Thirteen-year-old Harry Potter spends bad summer in his uncle’s house at Privet Drive. His uncle’s sister Marge comes to them. When Marge insults Harry’s parents, he loses his temper and accidentally causes her to blow up and fly away. Initially scared for using magic outside the school, he’s surprised that he isn’t going to be penalized after all. Soon he learns that a dangerous criminal and black magician’s trusted helper Sirius Black has escaped from the Azkaban prison and wants to kill Harry. To make it worse for Harry, some creatures called Dementors are appointed to guard the school gates. Luckily, crime is not committed.

Later, Harry learns that Sirius’s his godfather and he wasn’t a criminal, he was tricked. Many black spots in Harry’s past, whatever he learns about it, will be cleared up and he’ll have a clear vision of what the future has in stock.

The atmosphere of the film's breathtaking. It's impossible to take your eyes off the screen from the first minutes because every single detail involves you deeper into the action and sometimes you feel you're not one of audience-you're in the film! The thrilling and powerful visual and sound effects create virtually a world of another reality –so magic that you'll want to stay in forever.

What I especially liked was how Harry drives Dementors away from Sirius and himself. As for the real Voldemort's helper, he's an old friend of Sirius and Harry's parents.

I only disliked one thing about "Harry Potter and the prisoner of Azkaban". It is when a student named Draco Malfoy deliberately provoked a hippogriff, Buckbeak, who is kind to Harry, to attack him. Draco's father Lucius Malfoy has Buckbeak sentenced to death.

Fortunately, Harry and his friends turned out to be nearby and liberate the hippogriff, while Lucius and Care of Magical Creatures teacher are busy talking.

All in all, the atmosphere of magic which Alfonso Cuaron managed to create, the out-of-this-world environment, and the situation in which the main characters found themselves cause a thrilling effect. That's why I'd recommend watching this film both to the young and the adults-they will enjoy it!
